This characterful table has an outstanding top which is very tactile with a wonderful rich, lustrous patina and exceptional figuring It has an uncluttered, sculptural aesthetic and sits equally well in a period or a contemporary interior. This form with the central stretcher and no frieze rail is the most practical for sitting comfortably. It is in excellent condition and suitable for everyday use.
